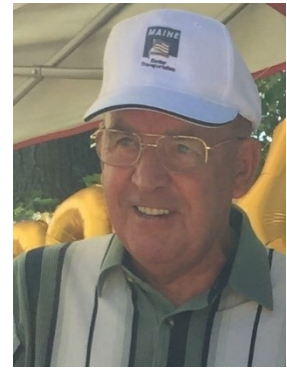

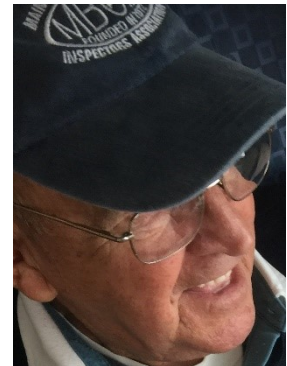

### Important Announcement

Due to Governor Mills' Executive Order restricting meetings to fewer than 50 people, the Select Board voted not to hold the regular Annual Town Meeting this year. Instead of the meeting, residents will vote on the warrant articles using the secret ballot process.

There are two separate elections scheduled in March:

Tuesday, March 9 - Maine Senate District 14 election will be held at the Town Office from 8am - 8pm.

Saturday, March 20 – Pittston Municipal Officer elections and warrant article referendum at the Town Office from 10am - 5pm.

Voting options:

- Absentee ballot: Registered voters may request absentee ballots for both elections by contacting the Town office either by phone, mail, or in person. Residents who are not registered to vote may register at the Town Office. Absentee ballots for voting in-person at the Town Office or by mail will be available for both elections starting February 9th.
- Polls will be open for in-person voting on the dates noted above. Residents may register to vote at the polls.

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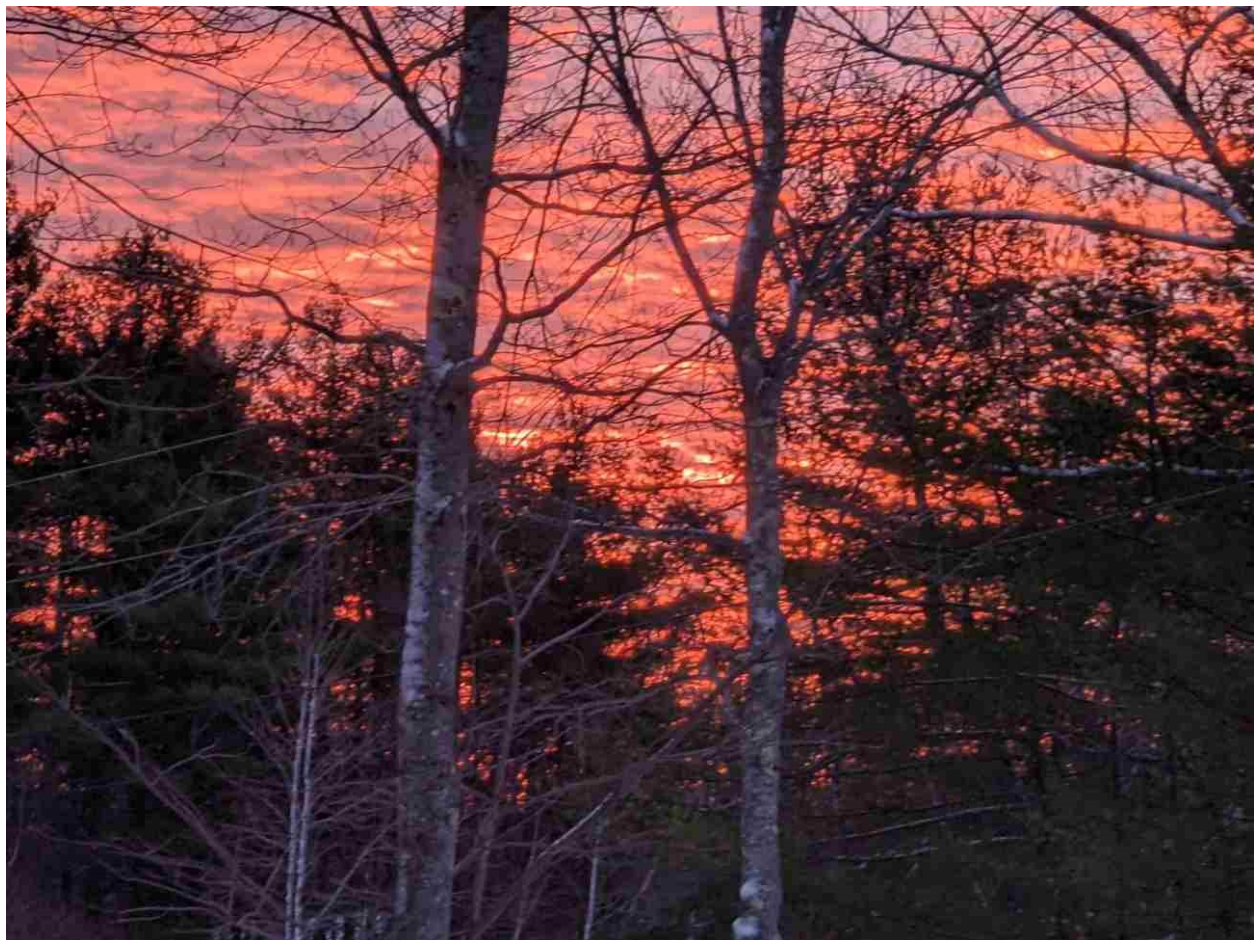

## From the Pittston Select Board

Dear Residents:

We all have had COVID-19 issues this year, but we would like to focus on the good things that happened in 2020, at least in our town. The best news is that we watched out for each other. Several citizens checked on their neighbors to offer help with errands and wellness checks.

The Town Office has several new upgrades. Overhead Door Company installed a wheel chair accessible door system to the front entrance. This system enables us to open the door with a push of a big blue button. Gary Trask replaced the original flooring in the front office and the meeting room with a beautiful laminate flooring system. James Weymouth Plumbing and Heating installed two new heat pumps in the meeting room. Augusta Fuel Company installed a generator and Main Street Fuel took care of the propane tank and fuel for the generator. We switched the security system to ADT to provide better visibility of the office and fire station parking lots. The new security system also improves the safety of our staff inside the office building.

Some of you may have seen the new “speed wagon” on the South Beech Hill Road this past fall as we are trying to get certification from Maine Department of Transportation for a lower speed limit. We also collected data on Jewett Road. We would like to thank Jim Lothridge for donating the trailer. Wayne Peaslee volunteered to mount the speed monitor onto the trailer, and Brayden Collins donated his time to paint it. Rodney Hembree and Fred Kimball learned how to use the data generated by the monitor.

The Town website, <https://www.pittstonmaine.org> has been upgraded and reformatted making the site more user friendly. Peter Coughlan, the Town’s webmaster, has been wonderfully cooperative and patient throughout this process. Fred Kimball, the newest Select Board member, donated his time and expertise to this project as well. If you have not visited the Town’s website recently, take a peek. We think you will like the changes.

We, along with the Personnel Committee, interviewed several candidates for the Tax Collector/Treasurer position. We are happy that Colleen Pilsbury has joined our office staff. She has lived in Pittston for thirty years and is enjoying getting to know more townspeople. Her valuable work experience has been a real asset for our Town Office.

Speaking of the very best asset in the Town, we salute our Town Office Staff. Deb Barry, Debbie MacInnes, and Colleen Pilsbury work so well together, they are experts, and they are so dedicated to the Town’s success. We are so fortunate to have this team!

A lot was accomplished in 2020. It could not have been done without the wonderful support of you, the Residents and Taxpayers. Thank you very much for your support. We are pleased to serve you.

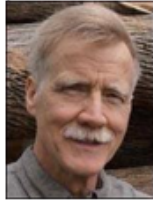

Dear Friends & Neighbors:

These are truly unprecedented times for our state and nation. Our patience and character are continually being tested during this period of social unrest. Accordingly, I am honored by the opportunity to serve as your representative in the Maine Legislature, and I welcome your thoughts as we continue to weather this pandemic together. The coming months of State governance will unfold unlike any other period in our 200+ year history. Now, more than ever before, is the moment for leaders to pull together in the best interests of those we serve.

For the 130<sup>th</sup> Legislature, I have been assigned to the Joint Standing Committee on Environment and Natural Resources (ENR), as well as the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation (TAX). Undoubtedly, the biggest agenda item for lawmakers during our First Regular Session is the biennial budget. The \$8.394 billion, two-year financial plan, will be heavily scrutinized over the weeks and months ahead. I look forward to collaborating with my colleagues to make certain every dollar sent to Augusta by you, the taxpayer, is used as efficiently as possible.

## From U. S. Senator Collins

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate. I am grateful for the trust the people of our State have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to reflect on 2020, an incredibly challenging year for Maine families, small businesses, and communities.

When the pandemic struck, our country faced the specter of an overwhelmed health care system and devastation to our small businesses and the millions of people they employ. I immediately worked with Republicans and Democrats to pass multiple laws allocating approximately \$3 trillion to respond to this public health and economic crisis, including more than \$8 billion directed to Maine to support testing, schools, the economy, and other purposes — that is nearly double Maine's annual state budget.

I am especially proud of the bipartisan Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) I co-authored. This program has provided three out of four Maine small businesses with nearly \$2.3 billion in forgivable loans, which has helped sustain more than 250,000 Maine jobs. I have met thousands of Maine small employers and employees in all 16 counties who are surviving because of the PPP. As one small business owner told me, the PPP provided “exactly what we needed at exactly the right time.” The PPP also allowed employers to maintain benefits, such as health care, during this challenging time. Another round of PPP is needed to sustain small businesses and their employees.

While the pandemic continues across Maine, our nation, and the world, I thank the first responders, health care professionals, teachers, grocery store employees, factory workers, farmers, truck drivers, postal employees, and so many others who continue to stay on the job during this difficult time. With the deployment of the first vaccines, better tests, and the incredible speed with which these life-saving responses were developed, I am hopeful we can emerge from this crisis in the next few months.

While providing relief to American families was my focus throughout 2020, other accomplishments include the passage of the Great American Outdoors Act, which provides full funding of the Land and Water Conservation Fund and addresses the maintenance backlog at our national parks, forests, and wildlife refuges. As Chairman of the Transportation Appropriations Subcommittee, in 2020 alone, I secured \$132 million to improve Maine's roads, bridges, airports, buses, rail, ferries, and seaports. Finally, as Chairman of the Aging Committee, I led the reauthorization of the Older Americans Act, which funds programs that improve the well-being, independence, and health of our nation's seniors and their caregivers, and I authored laws to reduce the cost of prescription drugs and protect individuals with Alzheimer's disease.

As the end of 2020 is approaching, I have cast more than 7,535 votes, never having missed one. In the New Year, my focus remains to work with colleagues to find common ground on policies to help support the health and safety of Mainers and the safe, responsible opening of our communities. If ever I or my staff can be of assistance to you, please do not hesitate to contact one of my state offices. May the coming year be a successful one for you, your family, your community, and our state.


Dear Friends,

2020 was a year unlike any in our lifetimes. Our state and nation dealt with unprecedented challenges--the coronavirus pandemic, ensuing economic fallout, and a prolonged, heavily divisive campaign season each took a significant toll on all of us. The worst part? In order to protect each other, we had to face these challenges in isolation. But a new year represents new possibilities; a chance to take stock of what we're grateful for and focus on the opportunities in front of us. As we reflect back on 2020, we will remember heartbreak and loss – but we cannot forget the shining rays of hope that broke through the darkness, reminding us all that better days are ahead.

Throughout the pandemic, my top focus has been on bridging the partisan divide in Washington in order to deliver desperately-needed relief for Maine people. Joined by colleagues last March, we pushed for bipartisan negotiations to produce a strong bill that helped fellow Mainers, businesses, and institutions weather this storm. In the weeks and months after the *CARES Act* passed, our team stayed in close contact with people throughout the state to determine how we should adjust our response to best support our citizens. Unfortunately, the aid provided by the *CARES Act* lapsed without Congressional action, leaving too many families and businesses in limbo. I never stopped pushing for a bipartisan relief bill and, after extensive negotiations, we ended the year on a good note by breaking the gridlock and passing new relief legislation. This new bill isn't perfect; in fact, it should just be the start of our renewed response. As we enter 2021 with a new administration and new Congress, we must fight for additional legislation to help restore stability to our working families and rebuild our economy and public health infrastructure.

In the midst of this crisis, Congress did manage to accomplish a few successes that will outlast this awful pandemic. Among these was the *Great American Outdoors Act*, a bipartisan bill which was enacted into law in August 2020 and will help address a \$12 billion backlog at our national parks so future generations of Americans can enjoy these beautiful lands and create lifelong memories. Also, as we learn more about the recent hacks of our nation's networks, there is help on the way: 27 of the cybersecurity recommendations made by the Cyberspace Solarium Commission – which I co-chair with Republican Congressman Mike Gallagher– made it into this year's defense bill. While there is no guarantee that these provisions would have prevented the massive hack, they will certainly improve our cyber defenses.

Despite the challenges, I'm hopeful for the future. Vaccines are being distributed across our state – starting with our healthcare heroes, who have sacrificed so much throughout this unprecedented catastrophe and deserve our eternal gratitude. If there can be a silver lining from these challenges of 2020, maybe it will be this: I hope that, in the not-so distant future, we will be able to come together physically and we will be reminded of our love for each other. We have differences, without a doubt. But as Maine people stepped up to support each other, we saw again and again that our differences pale in comparison to the values we share. We are one state, and one community – and there is nothing we cannot or will not do for each other. Mary and I wish you a happy and healthy 2021. We can't wait to see you soon.

## From Congresswoman Chellie Pingree

Dear Friends,

2020 has been a year of unconscionable loss and hardship. The COVID-19 pandemic has ravaged our nation, magnifying long-unaddressed inequities. I hear daily from constituents whose lives have been upended by the pandemic. As we navigate these ongoing challenges, my top priority in Congress has been to advocate for the resources Maine residents, businesses, and institutions need to weather this crisis.

In March, the CARES Act was signed into law, providing much-needed relief to Mainers, including expanded unemployment benefits, stimulus checks, grants and loans for small businesses and nonprofits, and funding for health care providers on the front lines of this crisis. As this crisis wore on, I saw increased need; that's why I voted for the Heroes Act in May and again in October to provide further support. I'm relieved we passed another relief package at the end of December, but I know another round of support is still much needed in the coming year.

The pandemic isn't the only crisis we face. Climate change threatens Maine's environment and industries. This summer, the Gulf of Maine recorded its hottest day, and we experienced the longest, most severe drought in 20 years. Maine farms continue to be stymied by climate change, but they can also play a crucial role in combatting it. In February, I introduced the Agriculture Resilience Act to ensure American agriculture is net-zero by 2045. The release of Maine's Climate Action Plan is a major step in the fight against climate change. I will continue to work with state leaders to ensure they have federal support to achieve this agenda.

2021 will offer different challenges. We must distribute a vaccine to millions, restore jobs, uplift the economy, and repair the divisions that undermine our ability to make meaningful change. I look forward to working with the incoming presidential administration to meet these challenges and emerge as a stronger, more resilient nation.

As always, the needs of Mainers guide my work as we recover from this crisis. If there is anything my office can do to help, please reach out.

**From Kennebec Country Sheriff Kenneth Mason**

January 4, 2021

The Kennebec County Sheriff's Office is pleased to make the following report regarding the services we provided to the people of Kennebec County in 2020. These services include the Law Enforcement Division, Corrections' Services, Civil Process, Court and Transport Division. We provided many regional assets to our communities including, Two K-9 Teams, Dive Team, Sex Offender Registry, Veterans Advocacy, Accident Reconstruction and Drug Recognition Experts (DRE).

I would like to begin by saying that 2020 was certainly a challenging and unusual year for all of us. COVID -19 changed all of our lifestyles and daily activities. It did not, however, change the fact that your Sheriff's Office continued to respond to calls for service as well as caring for the inmates incarcerated at our facility. In other words, it was business as usual for my staff. We just went about it a little differently.

In 2020, Law Enforcement Deputies in full-time and part-time capacity logged thousands of calls for service. There was a brief time of about three months from the middle of March to about the middle of June when calls for service were actually down, likely due to the COVID-19 outbreak. It was a welcome relief, as the threat of the viral infection was yet another caution our Deputies added to their daily routine.

Thanks to the Stanton Foundation, Kennebec received a \$25,000.00 grant to purchase another K-9. That grant paid for the dog (Brock) and all associated equipment training for Brocks handler, Deputy Zack Carey.

Since the beginning of the year, four new full-time patrol deputies have joined our ranks due to resignations or expansion of the division. Due to the State Police reducing their commitment to our call-sharing agreement, the Sheriff's Office has increased its patrol staff by three members.

The patrol division welcomes Phil Lynch, Brandon Van Wyk, Jordan Gaudet and Nathan Johnson. Deputy Lynch was a part time reserve deputy already working with us. Deputy Van Wyk came to us from the correctional division, and Jordan Gaudet and Nathan Johnson were already certified full time officers and came to us from Hallowell PD. We will be bringing on two new deputies in January of 2021 to fill our roster.

Our Civil Process Deputies serve legal documents on behalf of attorneys, the courts, citizens, local, and state government, landlords and other entities. In 2020, (Continued)

the three civil deputies received over 6,876 requests for service in Kennebec County. Some of the services include, civil summons & complaints, foreclosures, evictions, small claims, child support notices from the State, and enforcement of court orders and writs to name a few.

During the past year, our Correctional Facility managed 1,920 inmate intakes. The offenses committed by defendants included everything from Trespass to Homicide. Substance Abuse and the proper treatment of citizens with mental illness continue to be two primary concerns at the Correctional Facility.

Inmates at the Kennebec County Correctional Facility are asked to work and earn time off their sentences if applicable. Inmates who are considered to be a risk to the community work inside the facility cleaning and cooking, while others are supervised on outside projects. One may think that this only benefits the county, but it does not. It also benefits the inmate population as well.

We are committed to providing innovative programs to reduce crimes, assist victims, and to provide enhanced public safety. We acknowledge the ever-growing opiate addiction problem nationwide and have committed to partnerships at the Federal, State and Local levels to combat this problem. Our approach is aggressive enforcement, education, treatment and recovery for those afflicted with this horrible addiction.

I would like to thank all of my administrative staff who support the patrol division, detective division, correctional division and the civil deputies. The copious amounts of paperwork that is handled by these individuals is staggering and their work is greatly appreciated. Job well done by all.

As your Sheriff, and moving forward into 2021, my focus will remain steadfast in serving the people of Kennebec County and our visitor's.

## From Town Clerk Deborah Barry

What a year 2020 was! Elections and Town Meeting were cancelled and postponed a couple of times, due to COVID-19. We closed the office to the public on March 19<sup>th</sup>, while staff still worked limited hours. We then reopened to the public with strict guidelines on May 11, 2020. Finally, on July 11<sup>th</sup>, 2020 we were able to have the annual Town Meeting with 50 or less attending and 6 ft apart at the Pittston Fair Grounds in the Pulling Ring. Thankfully, the weather held out. Then on July 14<sup>th</sup>, 2020, we held the State, School, and Town Municipal Officers elections. Everyone was very patient and understanding of the new way to do things. Our November election went very well also, with a lot of absentee ballots and in person voting we had 75% of the voters in town voted. I was able to receive a \$5,000 grant to help with the election due to COVID-19. We also received reimbursement from the State for our new outside Absentee Ballot Box, which I believe, everyone really appreciated.



Due to State Guidelines, things will be done differently, we will be having Town Meeting by secret ballot on Saturday March 20, 2021 along with the Municipal Officers election from 10am to 5pm. Absentee ballots will be available for both elections. If you choose to write in a name, make sure to check the box next to their name, and please only write in a name of someone that is interested and available. As with all elections, the last day for absentee voting is 3 business days prior to the election, therefore, the last day to receive an absentee ballot by mail or in person will be March 17, 2021.

Just a friendly reminder, if you have not licensed your dog yet, there is now a \$25 late fee. Dog licenses are due December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. You do have a one month grace period before the late fee goes on, on Feb 1<sup>st</sup> each year.

You can also sign up for regular updates from the town by putting in your email address and first name. ## **Committee and Board Reports**

### **Animal Control Officer**

2020 brought many changes, some good, some bad. With more people home, dog at large complaints were up, most likely since Fido needed to go outside when adult owners were in the middle of their at-home job or the kids accidentally let Fido, or Fluffy, outside.

Feral or stray cat complaints were about the same. Feral and stray cats are a bottomless well of issues. If you have ferals or strays around your home, please arrange to have me trap them. They go to the shelter and get either fostered for adoption or placed in a barn buddy program for people who want barn cats for rodent control. All ownerless animals or those released to the shelter, get a full health exam, vaccinations, neutering and parasite tested. The shelter in Augusta only euthanizes animals that cannot be placed for serious health or aggression issues.

Please, if you have domestic pet type of animals that you can no longer care for and can't bring them to the shelter yourself, call me and we can make arrangements for them to be re-homed or brought to the shelter.

Per the Pittston Town Ordinances, if you call with a complaint regarding a domestic animal (not counting strays or ferals) you need to submit a written complaint. Any complaint has a chance of going to court, and for the District Attorney to accept that complaint for prosecution, they need written statements to include what happened, who was involved, descriptions, photos, if applicable, and any other information that would lead to a successful outcome. Each statement needs to include the writer's legal name, date of birth, address, and telephone number.

Last year the state put a hold on licensing your dog. That is no longer valid at this time. Please, get your dog licensed. If your dog runs off, a license helps return your dog without a trip to the shelter if it's during the hours the town office is open. While microchips are a great source of identification, the pet has to be brought to the shelter for it to be read. License tags and tags with the dog's name and your telephone number are a great way of keeping your dog out of jail.

Rabies is a big problem. There have been cases of rabid animals in Pittston. Get your dogs and cats vaccinated for this 100% fatal disease. Indoor cats can be infected by this disease, so even indoor cats need to be vaccinated. Not only is this the right thing to do for all involved, it is the law. Just because you see a normally nocturnal animal during the day does not mean it is rabid or sick. Mating season, those raising young, and those getting ready for winter by added food consumption will be out and about during the day time. Things to look for in both wild and domestic animals include, but are not limited to a poor appearance, circling, acting either abnormally aggressive or abnormally shy, inability to eat or drink, porcupine quills or skunk odor in wild animals, drooling, or attacking other animals when they normally run away from (except in the seasons where they are raising young, parents can be very protective of their young). If you suspect a wild animal of being rabid, contact the Maine Warden Service (207-287-8000), as I have no way of dispatching the animals.

My full-time job hours have changed. I work a 3-day rotation, 7:00 PM to 7:00 AM Friday, Saturday and Sunday and can usually not be reached except by text. (Continued)

If you have any questions about the care or health of your domestic animals, please don't hesitate to contact me. If I don't know the answer, I have many contacts who do have the answer.

Again, please license your dogs and get your animals vaccinated for Rabies. Even livestock can be infected, speak to your Veterinarian regarding vaccinations for those animals.

## **From the Superintendent: MSAD No. 11**

I wish to express my appreciation to the dedication of the MSAD 11 staff and administration who worked tirelessly over the past year to continue supporting and educating students. It has been difficult, scary, and stressful for many, but despite all of it, students are learning. Teachers and staff quickly learned how to teach remotely; free meals were made and distributed to all that wanted them; and, the logistics to operate a school district within the CDC restrictions were developed. Thank you to all the families and students that have patiently worked with us as we have implemented and refined our instructional models. The challenges these models have created for families has not gone unnoticed or unappreciated. It is my expectation that the start of the 2021-2022 school year will look more similar to last year than the current school year.

To help schools remain open throughout the pandemic, school districts around the state and the country received Federal COVID Relief money. As of this writing, MSAD 11 has received approximately \$3.7 million in COVID funds, of which \$3.3 million had to be spent in just four months. Due to the fast turnaround, the funds paid for items such as: upgrading our ventilation systems, purchasing technology hardware and software, installing wiring for remote and livestream instruction, hiring additional health care staff and substitutes, upgrading communication tools to allow for remote work when necessary, professional development for staff, and much more.

On Thursday, January 14, 2021 ground was broken at the Gardiner Area High School for the new Hoch Turf Field with an expected completion in advance of the 2021-2022 high school sports season. This \$1.1 million project is a reality thanks to the generosity of many donors including four local businesses, McGee Construction, MainEx, EJP, and Black Diamond Engineering that are donating approximately \$650,000 collectively in labor and materials to make this project possible. Purchased bricks will be used to create a recognition wall at the entrance to the turf field.

The town of Pittston remains a partner town of this regional service along with the municipalities of Gardiner, Farmingdale, Litchfield, Randolph and West Gardiner. The past year has been extraordinarily difficult for everyone, and that includes the delivery of library services. I am happy to report that these services are still available as we all grapple with a pandemic.

The delivery of library services has been a bit different this year, but I believe that these same services are more important than ever. Staff has pivoted to offering takeout services so that visitors may access the information they seek while still remaining at a safe distance.

Users of the Gardiner Library quickly discovered online content by downloading items from two services called Hoopla and Cloud Library. These services are purchased with funding from both the City of Gardiner and the Gardiner Library Association. We are also busy picking out content for families that have chosen a homeschooling model for this year and for families that have made this choice previously. We continue working with MSAD#11 to get up-to-date library cards to every student so that they also have access to all that the library offers.

The Gardiner Library Association, a nonprofit organization that owns the library building and the surrounding property, offered its assistance by budgeting more money for digital content while still maintaining this gorgeous 140-year-old building. This year, they rehabilitated the fence that surrounds the front garden, renovated the fire escape, and paid to have the windows caulked and painted in our reading room.

It has been a challenging year and the staff at the library excelled at helping our Lower Kennebec municipalities get the services they require from a 21<sup>st</sup> century library. I am especially thankful to everyone who supported the library all these years!

## Kennebec Land Trust

Dear Pittston Residents,

Since 1988, with the support of 1,100 member households and over forty Maine businesses, the Kennebec Land Trust (KLT) has worked cooperatively with landowners and communities to conserve our region's natural resources. KLT holds conservation easements on, accepts gifts of, and purchases significant lands to further the mission of the organization.

In May 2020, KLT purchased two parcels totaling 28 acres adjacent to the Trust's Eastern River Preserve on the Blodgett Road. This acquisition was made possible with generous funding from the Maine Coast Heritage Trust's Merrymeeting Bay/Marsh Migration Initiative. (Former Pittston residents Judy Schuppien and Phil Brzozowski donated the 22-acre Eastern River Preserve to KLT in 2018.)

With these additions, KLT's 50-acre Eastern River Preserve now protects 1,810 feet along Otter Creek and 4,120 feet along the tidal Eastern River, including valuable wetlands, woodlands, and wildlife habitat. The preserve's short, meandering path features Otter Creek and the Eastern River shoreline. Located off the Blodgett Road in Pittston, this preserve is managed to protect wildlife habitat and water quality, for low-impact outdoor recreation, and for nature observation.

At the time of the 2020 transfer to KLT, the former owners, Alex Vira, Joyce Tigano, and Barbara Georgette, recalled their early days along the Eastern River, sharing memories of fishing, picking apples, and walks on the shore. In the future, KLT is hoping to expand the Eastern River Preserve.

As land owners in your town, we contribute to Pittston's local tax base since the property we own is enrolled in the open space tax program. We are grateful to the town of Pittston for your cooperation and support. Thank you to the Pittston residents who have chosen to support KLT as members. We look forward to welcoming all residents to the Eastern River Preserve or one of our other properties or trails.



6. To spend an amount not to exceed one third of the budgeted amount in each category of the 2021 Annual Budget during the period from January 1, 2022 to the March 2022 Annual Town Meeting.
7. To appropriate 100% of the money received from the State of Maine for the registration of snowmobiles to be released to the Pittston Prowlers Snowmobile Club, Inc., for the purpose of maintaining their snowmobile trails, to be open to the use of snowmobiles at all times and to authorize the Select Board to enter into an agreement with the Club, under such terms and conditions as the Select Board may deem advisable for that purpose. Amount received is \$1,145.26.
8. To see if the Town will fix 30 days after Commitment and November 30, 2021 for dates when the taxes shall be due and payable, with an annual interest rate of 4% interest to be charged on unpaid taxes after said dates, and to allow the Tax Collector to collect prepayment of taxes prior to commitment pursuant to Title 35 M.R.S.A. § Section 36 (prepayment of taxes), and to fix the rate of interest at 3% to be paid on abated taxes pursuant to 36 M.R.S.A. § 505(436 M.R.S.A).

Recommendation of Select Board: 3 For, 0 Against, and 0 Abstain. Recommendation of the Budget Committee: 7 For, 0 Against, and 1 Abstain.

**Article 13:** To see if the Town will vote to increase the property tax levy limit of \$386,151 established for the Town of Pittston by State law in the event that the Municipal Budget approved under the preceding articles will result in a tax commitment that is greater than that property tax levy limit.
